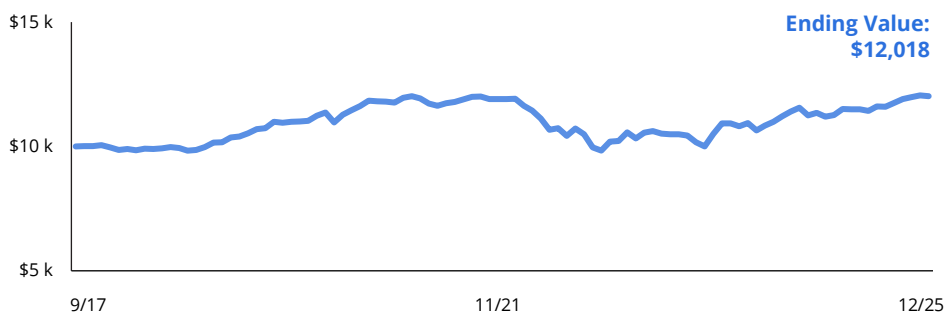

Effective Duration measures the sensitivity of an investment's price to nominal interest rate movement. **30-Day SEC Yield** reflects the hypothetical net current income earned, after the deduction of a fund's expenses, during a 30-day period, expressed as an annual percentage rate based on the fund's share price at the end of the period. Actual income distributions will usually differ. **Unsubsidized 30-Day SEC Yield** is the Fund's 30-Day SEC yield without the impact of fee/expense waivers.

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
